

Tu Bshevat



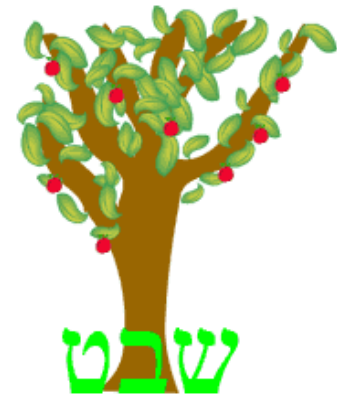
